

What is most important:

- Proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ whereby which someone, who may not know Jesus, comes to know Him and receives eternal life.
- The Word of God is the ultimate authority and absolute truth. It is the starting point and foundation for all knowledge. The Word of God is the source for all understanding and reasoning in all matters.

What is the truth (Pilate had trouble with this one, even though the Truth was standing before him):

- The Holy Scriptures, the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments is the absolute word of God. It is the verbal, plenary inspiration in the original writings, and God's preservation of His pure words to every generation. The interpretation of scripture comes from scripture itself.
 - There is one and only one living true God, an infinite, sovereign Spirit, the Maker and Supreme Ruler of heaven and earth; inexpressibly glorious in holiness and worthy of all honor, confidence and love; that in the unity of the Godhead there are three Persons, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, equal in every divine perfection and executing distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption.
 - The Genesis account of creation is historical and the universe (time, space and matter) was spoken into existence, in six literal, 24 hour days (“...and the evening and morning were the ... day”), without any random chance or blind evolutionary natural processes. The creation was a supernatural event and was perfect and contained no sin, death or suffering before the fall.
 - Adam and Eve were the first people and are literal and historic. They are the parents of all humanity from which all were made in the image of God and all of humanity are made of one blood. God created them male and female. God instituted and established marriage at creation, and it is recognized by God between one man and one woman until death.
 - The approximate age of the universe is 6,000 years old. The belief that the universe and the formation of the earth and the beginnings of life is millions or billions of years old is contrary to scripture and undermines the gospel of Jesus Christ.
 - All life is sacred and begins at conception. An unborn child is a living human being created in the image of God and must be protected before and after birth. Abortion constitutes the unjustified taking of a human life. Abortion is murder.

- Man was created in innocence under the law of his Maker, but by voluntary transgression, Adam fell from this sinless and joyous state and death entered the world. Since then, all men and the creation are now groaning and travailing in pain together which is the reason and need for a Savior. Man, and his sinful nature are partakers of Adam's fallen nature and are sinners by nature and by conduct. Therefore, we are under just condemnation without defense or excuse.
- Jesus was begotten of the Holy Ghost in a miraculous manner. He was born of Mary, a virgin, as no other man has ever been born or ever will be born. He is both the Son of God and God the Son.
- The only escape from the condemnation of sin is through the redemptive work of Jesus Christ. He voluntarily took upon Himself a human form and nature, yet was without sin. By His suffering, death and resurrection He made full satisfaction to the justice of God for the sin of man. The blessing of this salvation is given on the grounds of grace to all who believe, and that it is the immediate duty of all to accept these offers of mercy.
- Jesus Christ rose from the dead and ascended into heaven, where He now sits at the right hand of the Father as our Great High Priest.
- Faith in the risen Lord Jesus Christ and is the only solution of salvation from sin. This salvation is wholly by grace; that no works, however good, make that salvation more secure.
- Repentance is a change of mind and purpose toward God, prompted by the Holy Spirit; that it is characterized by guilt and sorrow for sin that is offensive to God and ruinous to the soul; and that true repentance is inseparably related to true faith.
- All who receive, by faith, the Lord Jesus Christ are born of the Holy Spirit and thereby become children of God.
- The unity of all true believers in Christ make up the body that is called the Church, which was established on the Day of Pentecost. Both Jews and Gentiles are added to this Church by the baptism of the Holy Spirit.
- Christ will return for His Church and then, after the tribulation, will establish His earthly millennial reign and sit upon the throne of David in Jerusalem.
- The heavens and the earth will be made new to a perfect condition, as they were before the fall. All pain, sin and death will be no more.
